#### What is a Presbytery?

It used to be that when I heard the word *presbytery*, it sounded like something far away — an office, a committee, or maybe just another meeting. Before this field education placement of mine started, I knew of it vaguely and understood that it included lots of folks, but it was something without a name or a face to it. But this placement has shown me how really, the presbytery is *us*. It's a gathering of churches, pastors, and elders working together so that none of us does ministry alone.

In the past few months. I've had the privilege of working closely with our interim presbyter, Marian, and stated clerk, Jerry. I've attended staff meetings, and listened in on various meetings, attending worship services and events, and practiced learning all of my "Presbyterian alphabet soup" acronyms. I've traveled to a lot of churches and met so many people. But what will stay with me long after this semester's work ends, is the love of God that I've witnessed from churches large and small. I've seen firsthand how this body lives out connectional ministry — how it encourages pastors, supports congregations in transition, nurtures new ministries, and helps churches imagine what's next. And I've watched teaching and ruling elders from across our region remind each other that the Holy Spirit is still at work in every corner of our presbytery.

The connection to the presbytery is one of the ways we embody being the *body of Christ* — many parts, yet one whole. When we send commissioners, share mission dollars, or participate in presbytery events, we're not just doing paperwork or paying dues. We're joining in a larger story — God's story of connection, care, and collaboration across congregations. Through our presbytery, we stand with those who are feeding the hungry, welcoming refugees, nurturing new worshiping communities, and training future leaders.

Please keep our presbytery in your prayers — its leaders, its congregations, and its ongoing work of helping us discern how to be the Church together, especially during this time of transition that's upcoming with the arrival of a new General Presbyter and new Stated Clerk. And mostly, thank you, all of you, for allowing me to observe so many of your meetings and worship services and for allowing me to serve the Mid-Kentucky Presbytery as an intern this semester.
